### LIBRARY

From Hilary Patrick, Librarian

#### Off the shelf

Friends may know that Robin and I are trying to make a bit more space in the library for some of the wonderful books we have. This should make it easier for people to find what they are looking for and give the place a slightly less cluttered feel.

So we are starting to remove some social interest books which we do not feel are essential to a Quaker library. They may be outdated or replaced by newer books. (They are in a box in the library and you are welcome to have a look and take anything you like the look of. OR tell us you really think a book should be kept. After a while they will go to a charity bookshop.)

I took home two of these books to read before they were consigned to the plastic box.

Karen Armstrong's *The Spiral Staircase* was her second, and much admired, autobiography. Her story is gripping, and very unusual. Having entered a convent at the age of 17, she left, traumatised, after seven years and for many years lived a life in which God was either ignored or resented. Her life as a young, bright, woman in the London of the 1970s and 80s as she struggles with ill health and precarious job prospects is vividly recreated. I will not spoil the ending but I found it very powerful and with quite a lot to say to us Quakers.

Bernhard Schlink (author of *The Reader*) was an East German law professor until he retired to concentrate on his novels. His *Guilt about the past* is a series of six essays about how countries and their people can come to terms with past crimes. What should our response be? And what about future generations? What is their guilt? Should we keep alive the memory of the horror? Or can that cheapen it as the events recalled become more remote with the passage of time? Schlink looks at forgiveness, reconciliation and retribution. He also considers the role of fiction. Can you write a comedy about the Holocaust, for example? Can you portray a good SS officer? While obviously based on his own experience, his arguments are relevant to us today. Should states apologise for past atrocities? How meaningful is saying 'we are sorry'?

Both these books are now on their way back to the plastic box. I hope you might be tempted.
