Spot the Quaker – answers to last month's quiz We asked, which isn't a Quaker?



The inventor of the Clangers, Bagpuss, and Noggin the Nog was Oliver Postgate. He was a Quaker, was imprisoned as a conscientious objector in the Second World War, and worked for nuclear disarmament and on environmental issues

The Music Festival creator Gerard Hoffnung came to London from Berlin to escape Nazism in 1938. He became hugely successful as a speaker, radio personality, cartoonist, and organiser of his famous series of humorous Hoffnung Music Festivals. He became a Quaker in 1955 and was well known as a prison visitor.



TV presenter Charlie Brooker does keep mentioning Quakers, but gives his religion as Atheist. In 2009 his contribution to The Atheist's Guide to

Christmas was entitled 'We don't need God, we've got biscuits'. It is said that his grandparents were Quakers. So he is the non-Quaker on this list.

It's hard to believe that Vietnam War

enthusiast Richard Nixon was a Quaker. He was brought up in a very conservative version of North American Quakerism which he reportedly felt handicapped his ability to communicate with ordinary people when working as a family lawyer.

Minutes of Local Meeting for Business, Sunday 20 January 2013

12 Friends were present. Prevented: David Turner, Alastair Cameron, Mary Jane Elton, Deirdre Armstrong.

Minutes of the Local Business Meeting held on 21 October 2012 have been circulated and signed.

Matters Arising

(22/12) – Wiston Lodge We have heard about work towards planning our next Wiston Lodge weekend (6 to 8 September 2013). It had been very good that we were joined by Friends from other meetings last year. A toolkit has been prepared describing the process – this is available to anyone helping.

Deirdre Armstrong, from Children's Committee has agreed to take part in the leadership team. Elders and Overseers are working to identify more people to assist in planning. They have identified two people to do bookings and other people are being approached to help with planning activities.

Kerry Oliver stressed that it is up to all of us in meting to contribute what we can to organising Wiston. A section will be added to the application form inviting people to indicate what contribution they can make. It will also be noted on the from that the cost of activities and group rooms is around £10 per head, and everyone will be invited to make a voluntary contribution towards this.

01/13 – Dates for LM business meetings in 2013 We agree to the list of dates for meetings which is attached to these minutes and we ask that this be published in the newsletter.

We ask Elders and Overseers to consider topics for talks for this year. Pol Yates suggested that a discussion on the economy would be useful. Anna Mitchell offered to talk on the Caledonian System, which offers a group work programme for domestic abuse offenders and support for their families.

02/13 - Coffee and tea after meeting for worship

Following our experience during the period when the upstairs room has been unavailable due to repair works, some Friends have suggested that we have tea and coffee downstairs, as this gives more opportunity for people to mingle. We agree to continue with this arrangement, and to review it at our July meeting. We remind Friends of the need to be aware of safety when young children and hot drinks mix. We will use the large table for serving drinks, and small tables are available for those who wish to sit and have a place for drinks. We ask the person who opens up to take responsibility for bringing the big table through.

We ask the person giving notices to invite volunteers for preparing and clearing up drinks, and to emphasise that these are jobs which nearly everyone can take on; new people can do it with an experienced buddy.

We agree that it will be helpful to have a regular round at the end of each meeting for worship where people say their names, with a pause between names. This would be helpful to new people, to children, and to those who have visual impairments. There is some concern that this will add to the time for notices, so we will review this at our May meeting.

03/13 – Morningside-Fairmilehead Christian Aid Committee We have been asked if a representative from our meeting could join this group. Sylvia Massey will contact them to ask exactly what is involved. She will then put an item in the newsletter asking for a volunteer.

04/13 – Edinburgh Churches Together Don Stubbings has asked us to find a Friend from South Edinburgh who would take part in Edinburgh Churches Together. The exact nature of the group is in a state of flux at the moment, so the nature of the work is not exactly clear. Alison Burnley has said that she would be interested in this, and we ask her to speak to Don, and to keep us informed about developments.

05/13 – All-age programmed meeting We heard a minute from Children's Committee proposing an all-age meeting on 3rd March. The theme will be "Making Choices". We agree to this, and invite anyone who would like to be involved in planning this to contact Deirdre Armstrong.

06/13 – Meeting with political representatives Our next meeting with our local South Edinburgh MP, Ian Murray, will be at 4pm on Friday 8th February, at the Labour Constituency Offices, 31 Minto Street.
