Minutes of Local Meeting for Business, Sunday 15th May 2011

14 Friends were present. **Prevented**: Rachel Howell, Alison Burnley, Mary Woodward, Alison Chalmers, Mary Jane Elton, Alastair Cameron.

Minutes:

Minutes of the Local Business Meeting held on 20 March 2011 have been circulated. We accept these, and they have been signed by the Clerk.

15/11 Local Meeting Annual Accounts

Our Treasurer, Martin Burnell has presented the meeting accounts for 2010. We accept these accounts, a copy of which is attached to these minutes, and we thank Martin for his work on them.

We note that £3000 has been transferred to Area Meeting as previously agreed. The amount raised for special collections has slightly increased.

Mini-Mart contributions are slightly up, but not enough to maintain the £30 per month contribution to Wiston Lodge. Payments to Wiston Lodge have been temporarily decreased to £25 per month. We have heard that while Wiston have had more visitors, they have severe cash flow problems and they are suffering from the effects of cutbacks to some of their client groups. We agree to continue our contribution for a further year and to review then. The amount of our contribution is relatively small, but we also recognise the importance of our support in terms of solidarity. We thank Kerry Oliver for here work in organising Mini-Mart.

Interest rates on our Shared Interest and Triodos accounts are now very low. We agree however to keep our capital reserve in these funds since they actively invest in causes which we wish to support. We ask the treasurer to keep the level of the capital reserve under review and transfer funds to this if required in the light of inflation.

We agree that Paul Kenny should be appointed, if he is willing, as the examiner for our accounts.

16/11 Special Collections

We agree to hold special collections in coming months for the following causes:

- July: Refugee Survival Trust (David Turner will speak about this)
- August: Thandi orphanage and school in South Africa (Deirdre Armstrong will speak)
- September: Parents' Circle Families Forum (Hilary Davies will speak).

17/11 Quaker week and outreach group

We note that the LM minute from our last meeting suggested that we would run our own outreach events. However we feel that the feeling of that meeting was more that we would offer to support Central Edinburgh events. Alison Burnley from South Edinburgh is involved in the planning group, and others are invited to join.

We note that the window display at the Open Door has been booked for Quaker Week. We ask Elders and Overseers to ensure that someone takes charge of preparing a display.

18/11 All age worship

We have heard from the group which is planning the All Age Worship to be held on 19 June. The theme is to be "Our Community". The form of the meeting will be a little different, but it will share the same elements of any meeting: seeking, and feeling a presence. We ask Friends to open their hearts and minds to this.

19/11 Clerking arrangements

We note that Elders and Overseers have organised a clerk training session to be led by Phil Lucas on 20 November. This will deal not just with clerking, but also with how we all contribute to business meetings.

Alison Chalmers has agreed to assist and support the clerk for business meetings, particularly with preparing agendas.

20/11 Custodian of records

Scotland General Meeting has issued a set of recommendations with regard to archiving of Meetings' records. All Meetings (AMs and LMs) have been asked to appoint a custodian of records, or at least nominate a Friend (who might for instance be the clerk or correspondent in a small meeting) to take responsibility for this. The GM Custodian of Records (Paul Burton) will co-ordinate the gathering together of records at specific times.

We note that the newsletter editor has a file of back issues of the newsletter. The clerk and the treasurer have copies of fairly recent minutes and accounts, but we are unsure where older records are stored.



21/11 New MSP


