I do hope these will be of interest to many Friends. Please let me know if there is a particular book or theme you would like to see in our library.



UNMISSABLE INTERNETS

Our Facebook page of the month is National Library of Scotland (11,640 likes), at whose own website maps.nls.uk you can look at a fantastic array of historic maps online. This is a snap from a 1780 map on which the New Town is future outlines, University buildings limited to Old College, the Royal Infirmary an even older one.



Part of the NLS collection is the **Scottish Screen Archive**. Try *The Singing Street* which shows childrens' street games and songs in the quiet streets of Edinburgh in 1950 ssa.nls.uk/film/0799

The songs were collected by science teacher James Ritchie from Norton Park School, where the film was made. Folk song collector Alan Lomax recorded many of the songs as well as some lovely fragments of interviews that you can get on the CD *Singing in the Streets* at the Museum of Childhood.
