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## Minutes of Local Meeting for Business, Sunday 17 October 2010

14 Friends were present. Prevented: Margaret Anderson, David Turner, Ida Turner.

**Minutes of previous meeting:** Minutes of the meeting of 18 July 2010 had not been circulated by email and a final copy was not available. This will be made available and approved at our next meeting.

### 17/10 – Review of clerking arrangements

The clerking group had met 10 days ago and had heard reports of the various functions being performed by different people. Although there had been some small difficulties, there were no problems we could not live with. The group will meet again in 6 months to review arrangements.

Children's Committee had welcomed Rachel Howell's invitation that children say what they have been doing in Children's Meeting, right after the welcome to visitors at the end of meeting for Worship. We wish for this to continue.

We agree that it should be a priority to circulate agendas and minutes in advance, to help those with accessibility needs.

We have heard that Judith Shepherd has resigned her membership of the Society and therefore cannot continue in the role of co-clerk. Judith has written to Elders and Overseers explaining her reasons for this, and we ask Elders and Overseers to offer any appropriate support. We thank Judith for her work as co-clerk, and we also thank Alastair Cameron for stepping in for today at short notice.

We feel that this Meeting does not require a formal Nominations Committee, and that Elders and Overseers can fulfil this role. We therefore ask Elders and Overseers to consider the matter of a replacement co-clerk at their next meeting on 1 November. We will mention the need for a co-clerk on the email list and in the newsletter, with a description of what the role involves, and inviting expressions of interest.

Mary Jane Elton has volunteered to co-clerk for the next LM if no one has yet been appointed, and we accept her offer.

### 18/10 – Arrangements for Christmas

We will hold a Christmas party on Saturday 18 December, at the Open Door, for everyone associated with South Edinburgh Meeting.

It was felt that some members without children do not feel involved in the Christmas party, so we propose that we also hold a lunch after Meeting for Worship, followed by games and quiet reflection, some time in

January. We ask Elders and Overseers to take this forward and set a date, and we ask them to make arrangements for care of the children during the time of reflection.

We note that Lanark Meeting will hold Meeting for Worship at Wiston Lodge on 19 December, followed by lunch, to which all are invited. There will also be Meeting for Worship at the Open Door as normal that day.

We note that the filling and covering of shoeboxes for Oxfams is no longer solely the responsibility of Children's Committee. Sylvia Massey will announce a date for adults to help with covering boxes. Sylvia will also liaise with Peggy Bartlett to organise.

We plan to have a time for singing carols and other seasonal songs after Meeting for Worship on 12 December. We will ask Jane Lewis if she would be willing to facilitate this.

### **19/10 – Special Collections**

Mary Woodward has met with Hilary Davies and Judith Shepherd to discuss the process for deciding on the causes for special collections, which needs to be reviewed in the light of the new clerking arrangements. We feel that it would be valuable to reflect more deeply on why we give, and to what causes, and whether it might be good to give longer term commitment to one particular cause which we could learn about in more detail. We agree to have a further discussion of this, involving everyone, after Meeting for Worship at some point. We ask Elders and Overseers to set a date for this. We ask Hilary Davies to obtain the list of projects supported by various Meetings which was published in Quaker News, and to circulate this.

We recognise the importance of supporting causes which people in Meeting have a particular link to and can speak about. We also feel that it is enriching to contribute to a range of causes which we may not necessarily have heard of before.

### AFTERWORDS

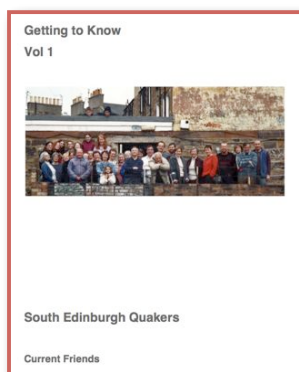
#### An experiment at the end of meeting

For 6 weeks from January

After the close of meeting, and before notices, there will be a brief opportunity for 'afterwords or prayer requests'. This is a time when anyone may speak of anything that has been on their mind during meeting for worship that didn't seem suitable to offer as ministry (or for which there wasn't time), or may ask for a person or situation (including themselves), to be held in the Light.

Although not part of the formal meeting, 'afterwords and prayer requests' is still held in the spirit of meeting for worship and therefore is not a discussion, or a chance to respond to ministry in a way that wouldn't be done during worship. The main point is to offer the chance for people to share concerns and thoughts that are not ministry as such but that may be important in terms of sharing with each other in the things which are eternal"
